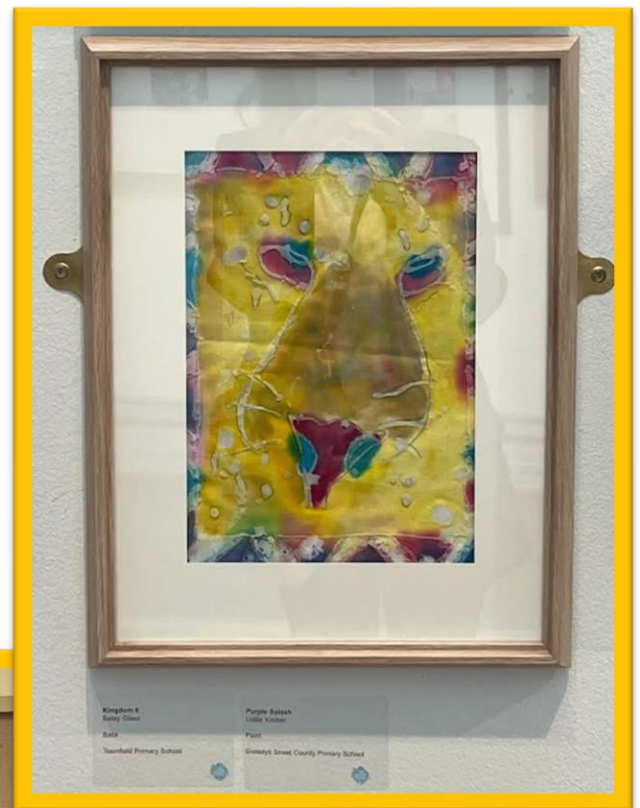

## Debate Society

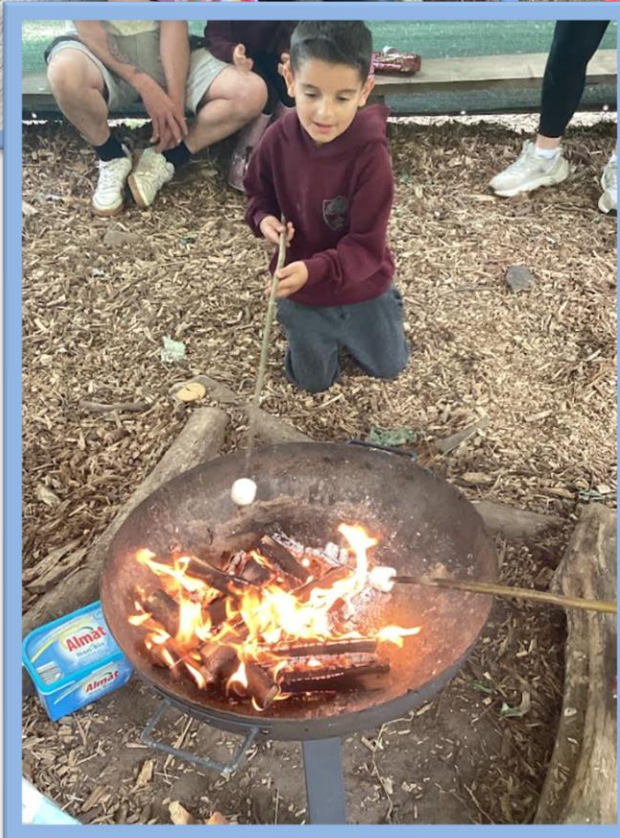

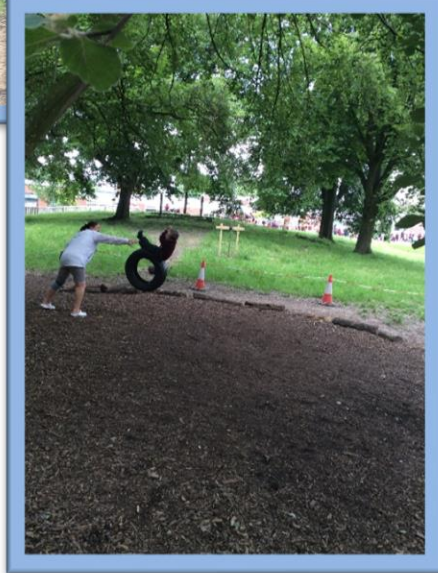
## Forest Sessions

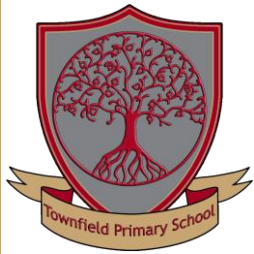

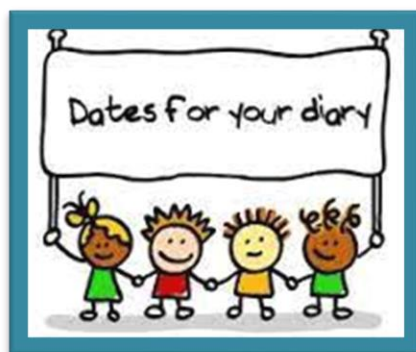
