### Election Speech

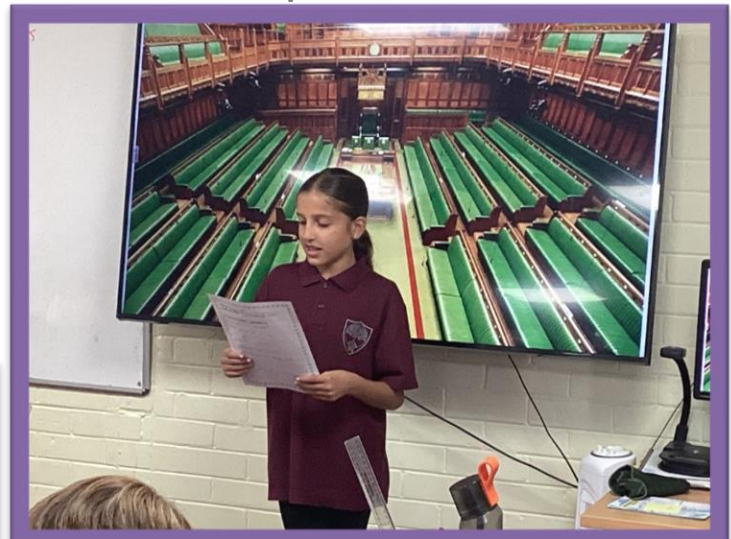
